Letter from the Presbyter

The Marriage Supper of the Lamb

Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns ⁷ Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his Bride has made herself ready; it was granted her to clothe herself with fine linen, bright and pure"— (Revelation 19:6-8)

January is the month when we have many weddings. The vows that the bride and groom make in the marriage ceremony has a deep meaning. The promises that the couple make at the altar are very solemn. "I take you to be my lawful wedded wife, to hold and to cherish, for better or for worse, in sickness and in health, for richer or for poorer till death do us part." This is follows from what our Lord taught us about marriage. He said, "So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate." (Matthew 19:6)

The bride and the groom represent the church and the Lord Jesus Christ. Wives are to submit themselves to their own husbands as to the Lord. Just as the husband is the head of the wife, Christ is the head of the church (Ephesians 5:23) Husbands are to love their wives just Christ loved the church and gave himself for her. Jesus earned the Bride by giving his life on the Cross. He shed his blood so that he might present himself a Bride, a glorious church without spot or wrinkle, holy and without blemish (Eph 5:27) Husbands are to love their wives just as our Lord loved and loves the church. They are to dwell with their wives with understanding, giving honour to the wife, as to a weaker vessel and as being

heirs together of the grace of life, that their prayers may not be hindered (1 Peter 3:7). The church is the bride of Christ. Just as the bride wears the beautiful white dress for the wedding, the church also wears the fine linen. The church is the body of believers who have been cleansed from their sins because of the shed blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Our Lord made the New Covenant in his blood for the forgiveness of sins. This clothing also represents the good works that the believers have done for the Lord. (Rev 19:7)

The church is in eager expectation for the coming of the Bridegroom, the Lord Jesus Christ. In Revelation 22, the last chapter of the Bible we find our Lord telling the church that he is coming quickly. The bride responds with the words, "Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus." (Revelation 22:20)

How can we be ready for the marriage supper of the Lamb? By living a life of obedience to our Lord Jesus Christ. If we love him we will keep his commandments, walk with him and share with all people the forgiveness and healing and friendship that we share in him. God has also anointed us with the Holy Spirit through whom we have power to do good works. Let us spend more time with him and share the good news with more people. "Come, Lord Jesus."
