Reformation Sunday 30 October '16

In 1517, Martin Luther wrote *The Ninety-Five Theses*, where he stated that the selling of



indulgences, purgatory, and the doctrine of the merits of the saints had no foundation in the gospel. Many doctrines and devotional practices had actually no scriptural basis.

The three truths that have been taught by the Reformation are i) the sole authority of Scripture, ii) justification by faith and iii) the priesthood of the believer. The watchword of the Reformation was ***sola Scriptura*** (*by Scripture alone*)

As we give thanks for our Reformers may God give us grace to know and to speak the truth of the saving gospel of our God.

Rt. Rev Bishop ashoke Biswas, Respected Principal, Mr. John Rafi, members of the staff, distinguished guests and my dear students – I consider it a privilege and a blessing to be with you this afternoon on the occasion of your 181st Founer's Day Commemoration Service. I want to thank his Lordship, the Bishop and all of you for your kind invitation.

You are all fortunate to be part of the La Martiniere's long and rich tradition. I am sure, La Martiniere School gives you the integral formation to be what you are in Society, to be leaders wherever you live and work, and to be men for others at the service of humanity.

Today, India has 1.27 billion people, which is 18% of the world's population. India is the world's largest democracy with 825 million eligible voters. India has today, 19 lakh schools with a student strength of 330 million and 22 million teachers. India also has around 36000 colleges, 760 universities with a student strength of 320 million and 8 lakh teachers.

India is also the most youthful country today in the world with 60% of its population between the age group of 15 and 50 years.

Yes, as many of us know, India has adopted faster, sustainable and more inclusive growth as a policy platform in its 12th five-year plan.

But the saddest side is - only 25% of those who come out of our colleges are relevantly employable and our Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) is only 22.5%, while the global average is 65%. Our average growth rate is 6.5% but the benefits do not trickle down to the common people.

As Mahatma Gandhi said, "Villages are the temples of prosperity and Schools and Colleges are temples of knowledge and wisdom, our Schools and Colleges have a greater responsibility in imparting education that is transformative and humanizing, because the country needs educational institutions to change the face of this county. We are the agents of change and transformation and so I wish you all the best in your formation and later in your life to be instruments of peace and love.


